#### Principal's Message

#### **NESA Inspection**

The inspection conducted by the NSW Education and Standards Authority (NESA) in August was concluded with successful outcomes. Irfan College received a renewal of registration and accreditation of five years for Years 7 & 8 and also obtained initial registration for Year 9.

# **Increase of Student Numbers**

Another major development in our College's history was the Development Application to Council to increase our student capacity to 300. The approval of this application will be a huge milestone for Irfan College as this increase will accommodate years K-12.

#### Completion of Double-storey Complex

The commencement of construction for our double-storey complex in July is in its final stages. We are working hard to obtain the Occupancy Certificate for the new facility prior to the beginning of the new academic year. The new complex will house a brand new commercial kitchen, science lab, and state of the art classrooms. Each classroom will have an Islamic theme and will be named after an Islamic thinker or leader within the Islamic tradition that has contributed to the field of science and the Islamic sciences.

# School Readiness Program (SRP)

An exciting new initiative Irfan College implemented this year was the SRP for our new Kindergarten cohort. Students that had gone through the first process of enrolment participated in a five week program which comprised of students attending school one day a week

and going through the Pre-lit program. The SRP allowed our new Kindy students to familiarise themselves with the school culture, their class teacher, and daily routines.

We thank Allah (swt) for blessing us with such a productive year. We pray to Allah that He bestows upon a safe and enjoyable break and look forward to seeing everyone in 2018.

# School Holiday Parent Kit – Tackling stress

The everyday responsibilities of parenting can sometimes feel endless. Considering all the extra demands placed on you during the school holidays and festive season, you may feel more stressed than usual.

What your family and your children really want most is to spend time with you.

Holiday stress may be caused by having to change work routines or child care arrangements, stretching the budget to meet the costs of the festive season, entertaining children or dealing with older children staying home alone.

Although we cling to the idea that the family will spend the holidays together and everyone will get along, it can be a difficult time.

When you are stressed it seems as though you have to sacrifice the things you enjoy. But often the things you give up, such as keeping fit and spending time with friends, are activities that can help you manage stress or keep you from becoming frustrated with your children

It's also important to remember that grief can be particularly heightened at this time of year. The loss of a family member, a divorce, the loss of a job or being separated from family and friends can be particularly stressful.

By taking some steps now, you can help to minimise stress later. The key is to recognise the triggers. Do what you can to avoid or lessen their impact and learn some techniques to help you relax should you start to feel the tension rising.

Here are some simple tips to keep you healthy and manage stress. By looking after yourself you will be in a better position to care for your children.

- Set priorities: learn to say "no" to some things - choose quality over quantity. Your main priority may simply be spending time with your children and enjoying each other's company.
- Plan ahead: take charge of your holidays in advance by making lists of things to do and setting aside some time each day for them - nothing creates more stress than last minute shopping and preparations. When entertaining children, one different activity each day will keep them
- Stay in budget: draw up a budget to make sure you don't overspend over the festive season. Choose simple, thoughtful or useful gifts over elaborate, expensive surprises.
- Delegate: you don't have to do it all yourself - there is only so much time and people generally appreciate the opportunity to help out. If you are having a family get together, it might be a good idea to ask everyone to bring along some food rather than preparing it all yourself.

- Have realistic expectations: if there
  is tension within your family it is more
  than likely that this will only escalate
  during the holiday period. You might
  consider visiting your relatives
  separately if they do not get on well or
  keeping them occupied when together.
- When making new year's resolutions, think positively about what you can really achieve. Unrealistic goals can cause disappointment.
- Look after yourself: to take care of others you need to first take care of yourself. A healthy diet, regular exercise, learning to relax and getting enough sleep will also help to reduce stress.
- Exercise: research shows that exercising several times a week (even just a walk) can reduce stress and tension and improve your mood.
- Deep breathing: spend five to ten minutes several times a day practising the art of deep breathing. It helps to raise your energy levels.
- Positive attitude: try to think positive thoughts. Your thoughts influence your feelings - if you dwell on unhappy thoughts, you start to feel unhappy. Your attitude can be transferred to others and this is not helpful with children at home.
- Talk to others: if you are feeling stressed it can help to speak with people who can understand the position you are in, such as friends or family members.
- Laughter: nothing reduces stress as quickly or as effectively as a good laugh!





### TERM 4 IN YEAR 7 & 8



Stage 4 Science students participated in an array of activities throughout this term. Year 7 students explored the science behind the classification of living things. We also looked at the intricate details surrounding the beginning of our universe. Students learned about the similarities between the Aboriginal and Islamic teachings regarding the creation of the universe. Year 8 students learned about chemical and physical reactions. They investigated chemical change by making their own 'fireworks' using the variety of coloured metallic salt compounds. In addition, Year 8 students spent time exploring the rock cycle and used our rock sample kits





In PDHPE, stage 4 students prepped for the Athletics Carnival that took place in week 4. Students participated in a variety of competitive track and field events including shot-put, long jump, high jump and sprint and relay races. Following the carnival students have been working on improving their fitness by practicing a range of physical fitness tests including the Beep Test to improve cardiovascular endurance.

### TERM 4 IN MATHS


#### Maths

This term, Year 8 History students studied the Spanish conquest of the Americas explored the Aztec and Mayan civilisations amongst others.



### Term 4 in TECHNOLOGY MANDATORY
